Present continuous 100%

Fixed plans = Arrangements

Present simple

schedules / timetables

Future perfect WILL + HAVE + P.P.

complete actions at a specific time in the future

Future continuous WILL + BE + (verb+ING)

actions in progress at a specific time in the future

unlikely events
suppositions
unreal things
advice/recommendations

If + past,

modal verb

would should

+ verb.

3rd Conditional


regrets in the past

If + past perfect

modal + HAVE + participle.

He was made to apologize (to her). Passive to be


Sarah made her boyfriend cook. Active
